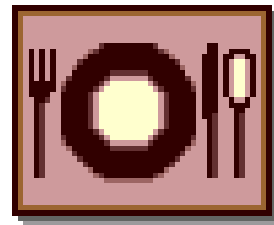

Administrative Service Summer Internship Programme



Civil Service Bureau

The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region

The following information was received from Hong Kong Economic & Trade Office, Sydney.

The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region invites full-time students who will complete their degree studies in 2009 to apply for the Administrative Service Summer Internship Programme.

Entry requirements

Participants in the Programme are required to fulfill the following requirements:

- (a) Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Permanent Resident status;
- (b) Full-time students who will complete their bachelor degree or postgraduate degree programmes in the summer of 2009;
- (c) Commitment to serve the community;
- (d) Possession of leadership qualities;
- (e) Ability to work in a team;
- (f) Active participation in community/school activities;
- (g) Outstanding academic achievements; and
- (h) Good command of both Chinese and English.

Employment period: about two months between June and August 2008 (but the actual employment period for different cases may vary). Participants are normally required to work 44 hours per week.

Remuneration: HK\$7,300 per month (including contribution to Mandatory Provident Fund). Note: no allowance will be given to appointees currently residing outside Hong Kong to cover their traveling expenses to and from Hong Kong or their expenses during their stay in Hong Kong.

Application procedures

Application deadline: **by mail by 25 April 2008** (according to postmark)
